Litigation and Cases

<u>United States v. Hiser</u>, CAAF's case of first impression interprets language in <u>UCMJ</u> art. 117a.

In <u>U.S. v. Dial</u>, the judge has ruled a unanimous verdict is required for guilty findings, contrary to established law. (Since <u>Ramos v. Louisiana</u>, the military is the only jurisdiction with non-unanimous verdicts.) As a result, the Army Court of Criminal Appeals granted a stay of proceedings.

- The Government has filed a Petition for a Writ of Prohibition with ACCA on Jan. 24, 2022. CAAFlog is covering the case at https://www.caaflog.org/home/unanimity-ruling-of-note.
- The same has happened in <u>United States v. Ferriera</u>, in which the same military judge presides.
