Army TJAG has sent a *Brady* notice, not sure about the other Services. It has long been known that poppy seeds in food may cause a positive urinalysis for codeine. The Brady notice now acknowledges this. The full notice with research attached is <u>at this link</u>. At that link is also a memorandum recommending that servicemembers be advised not to partake of foods that have poppy seeds—such as bagels, salad dressings, cake.
